

## There's a Psalm for This

It feels like Christmas is just around the corner (probably because it is)! We've got packages mailed, and most of our preparation is done. Even the decorations of the church have been coming up, which I know you've been noticing! It is almost time for Jesus' birth and the Day of the Lord, when we rejoice at the birth of our Savior.

### Psalm 96 (CEB)

Sing to the Lord a new song! Sing to the Lord, all the earth!  
Sing to the Lord! Bless his name! Share the news of his saving work every single day!  
Declare God's glory among the nations; declare his wondrous works among all people  
because the Lord is great and so worthy of praise.  
He is awesome beyond all other gods  
because all the gods of the nations are just idols,  
but it is the Lord who created heaven!  
Greatness and grandeur are in front of him; strength and beauty are in his sanctuary.

Give to the Lord, all families of the nations—give to the Lord glory and power!  
Give to the Lord the glory due his name! Bring gifts! Enter his courtyards!  
Bow down to the Lord in his holy splendor! Tremble before him, all the earth!

Tell the nations, "The Lord rules!  
Yes, he set the world firmly in place; it won't be shaken.  
He will judge all people fairly."  
Let heaven celebrate! Let the earth rejoice! Let the sea and everything in it roar!  
Let the countryside and everything in it celebrate!  
Then all the trees of the forest too will shout out joyfully  
before the Lord because he is coming!  
He is coming to establish justice on the earth!  
He will establish justice in the world rightly.  
He will establish justice among all people fairly.

Psalm 96 is one of the readings on Christmas Eve this year, and it speaks of a coming king, whom we already know, who will make things right. He is worthy of our praise, and he will rule with justice for all people. But then the coming king shows up, and he's born among animals. He shows up and the only people giving glory to his name are some shepherds.


That's the unique thing about this king: everything Psalm 96 says about Jesus is true, but it's also not how we expect. We have a king who set aside all that glory to become a human. Who put aside even divinity for a time to live among us and die for us. He rules now precisely because Jesus gave those things up. And that's why he deserves to rule.

That is our king: the one who will rule perfectly yet also put it aside to become the opposite of a king: a poor peasant craftsman living in the boonies of ancient Israel. And that's why we celebrate Christmas, not because of Jesus' glory, but because of his humility that we are called to emulate.
